Safety Awareness Sheet

Water & Food Supplies

- Bottled Water (minimum one gallon per day per person)
- Food Supplies (ready to eat foods that DO NOT require refrigeration, cooking and require little or no water):
- Canned meats, fruits & vegetables
- Canned Juices
- Crackers
- Dried Fruit, nuts
- Dry cereal
- Non-perishable pasteurized milk
- Peanut butter
- Protein & fruit bars
- Pet food

First Aid & Medicines

- Antibiotic towelettes or cleansing soap
- Burn ointment
- Crutches, cane or walker (if needed)
- Diabetic test kit and supplies (if needed)
- Fever thermometer
- Latex or sterile gloves (2 pairs)
- Medicine dropper
- Oxygen supplies (if needed)
- Petroleum jelly
- Prescription medicines (rotate to account for expiration dates)
- Scissors
- Sterile Dressings and bandages
- Tweezers
- Non-prescription Medicines:
 - Antacid
 - Anti-diarrhea medication
 - Aspirin and non-aspirin pain reliever
 - Cold & flu medicines
 - Cough syrup
 - Laxative
 - Vitamins
- First aid instruction booklet

For Infants

- Baby wipes
- Bottles
- Diaper rash ointment
- Diapers
- Favorite blanket
- Favorite toy
- Formula
- Medications
- Powdered milk or formula

Survival Kit Basics

- Hand-crank or battery powered radio (and extra batteries)
- Can opener (manual)
- Cash, travelers checks, credit/ATM cards
- Fire extinguisher: small canister, ABC type
- Flashlight(s) (and extra batteries) and/or lightsticks
- Map of the area & evacuation routes as well as shelter locations
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Whistle and signal flare to signal for help

Sanitation

- Plastic trash bags, ties
- Toilet paper, towelettes
- Plastic bucket with tight lid
- Disinfectant
- Feminine supplies
- Household chlorine bleach
- Personal Hygiene items

Clothing & Bedding

- One complete change of clothing per person
- Hat and work gloves
- Rain jacket, slicker or coat
- Long pants & Long sleeve shirt
- Sleeping bag/blankets
- Sturdy shoes

Tools & Hardware

- Small ax
- Hammer
- Screw drivers
- Pliers
- Pry bar
- Utility knife
- Duct tape
- Plastic sheeting
- Shut-off wrench, to turn off water and gas

Miscellaneous

- Books, toys, games, deck of cards to occupy time
- Identification & current photo of all household members
- Cell phone, walkie-talkies, chargers and/or spare batteries
- Laptop w/spare batteries, wireless internet card
- Compass
- Contact lenses and supplies
- Denture supplies
- Hearing aid batteries
- Leashes, carrier, cages to contain pets
- Magnifying glass
- Moist towelettes
- Paper cups, plates and plastic utensils
- Paper towel
- Paper and pencils
- Plastic storage containers
- Spare pair of prescription and/or reading glasses
- Tube tent
- Watch or battery operated clock
- Hibachi and charcoal (for outdoor use, in safe areas only)

Remember, some shelters will not accept pets. Check with your local shelters to see about pet facilities.
